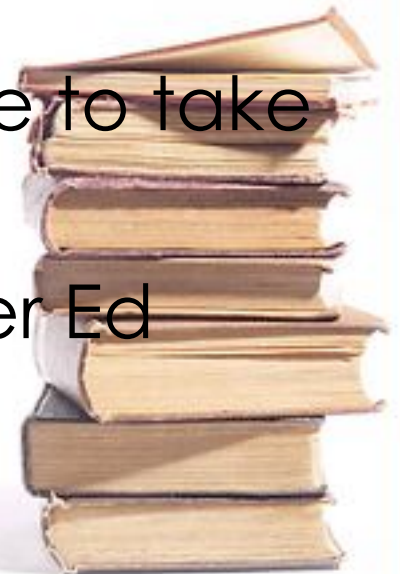

Overall Total	80
Of the 80 credits for graduation, at least 16 must be at the Grade 12 level, including a Grade 12 Language Arts course. Others may be required or elective courses	



What you need to Graduate

- **48** credits from required courses
- **28** credits from elective courses
- **4** credits Career Life Connections (Capstone Project)
- **Total of 80 credits to graduate**
- Of the 80 credits, **16** must be from **Gr. 12**
- Program incorporates Grades 10, 11, and 12

Elective Courses

- 28 credits from courses numbered 10, 11, or 12
- 16 of the 28 credits must come from courses numbered 12
- This is in addition to the required courses for graduation



Elective Courses (continued)

- Purpose of elective courses is to select courses based on your interests, aptitudes, abilities, and future plans
- Post secondary institutions and programs might have specific requirements that may need to be considered

GRADE 12 students will:

- Follow the 2018 Graduation Program requirements
- Write:
 - Provincial Literacy Assessment
(Before Graduation)
 - Provincial Numeracy /Literacy Assessment
(Grade 12 (if not written in grade 10 or 11) - Before Graduation)



Career Life Connections

- 30 hours of work experience or community service. **(Grade 11)**
- Students will create a personal plan that will help them set goals for post-secondary education or career pursuits **(Grade 12)**
- Presentation of their personal plan
 - Capstone Project **(Grade 12)**



Carney requirements...

- **Grade 10 and 11** students take **8 courses** on the timetable in addition to Career Life Education 10 and Career Life Connections 11
- **Grade 12** students must take a minimum of **8 courses** within the timetable in addition to Career Life Connections 12
 - Grade 12 students who are eligible can request an Academic Study Block.

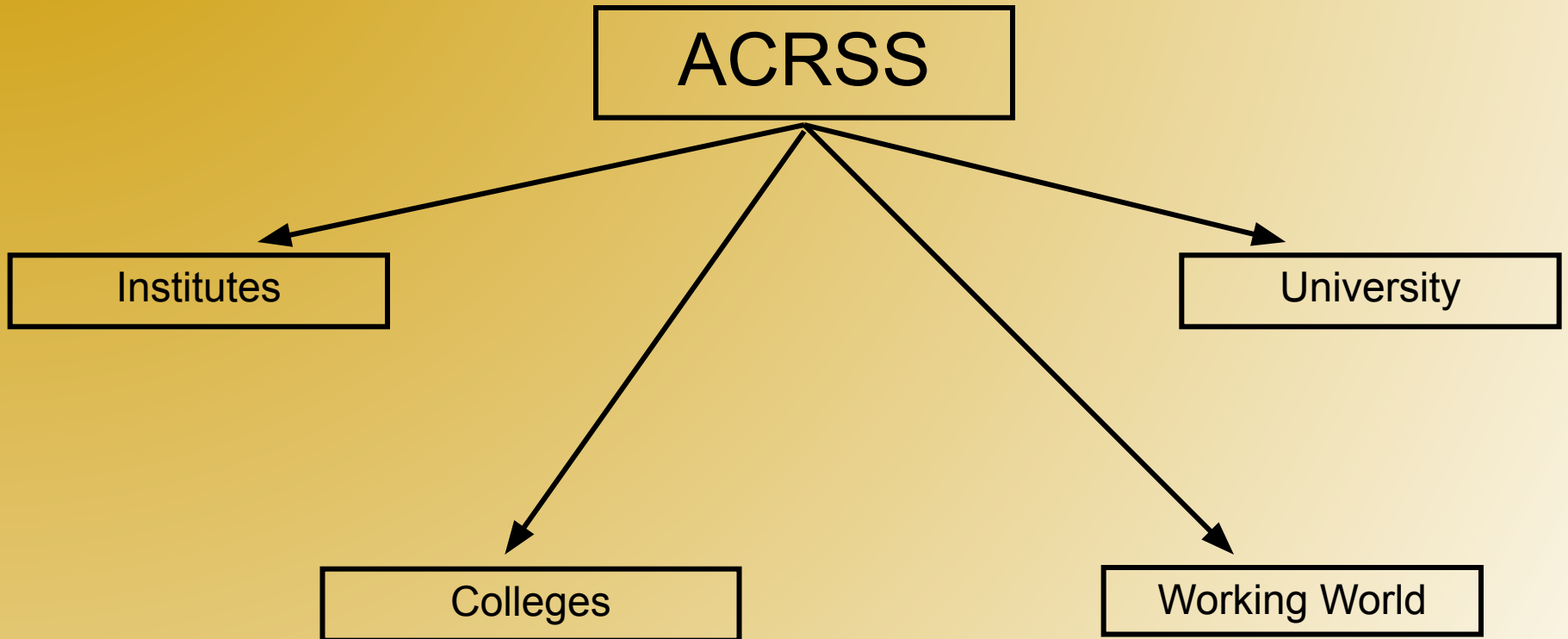

POSTSECONDARY OPTIONS

- **INSTITUTES:** a post-secondary school that provides specialized training in technologies, trades, art and design, law enforcement or indigenous studies.
- **UNIVERSITY :** an educational institution that offers degrees at the Bachelors, Masters and Doctoral levels.



Universities in BC

- *Undergraduate Degree Programs*
 - University offers Undergraduate degrees in a selection of specific programs
 - Offer academic and applied degree programs at the Bachelor's, Masters and Doctorate levels



Colleges

Douglas College, Langara College...

- *Career Programs*
 - 1 year Certificate
 - 2 year Diploma
- *University Transfer Programs*
 - Must complete at least 30 credits with sufficient GPA
 - Complete 1 or 2 years of university at college level

Corpus Christi (on the UBC campus)*

- For students who would like to continue their Catholic education at the post-secondary level

Entrance Requirements

Institutes

- Varies by program
- Ranges from high school completion to specific selection of courses
- see program guide for specific entrance requirements

Colleges

- General Entry: high school completion
- Specific Programs: varied
 - see program guide for specific entrance requirements



Entrance Requirements

- University
 - English 11, a Math 11, Science 11
 - Second Language 11 (Beginner's okay at SFU)
 - Grade 12
 - English 12 + 4 Grade 12 approved courses (minimum)
 - Courses are dependent on the area of study (Faculty) that a student applies to enter



Entrance Requirements

- Registration Requirements
 - These requirements enable students to register for a first year course
 - Might need to achieve a specific mark in a Grade 12 course or write an external exam (ex. LPI)
 - See university guides for specific requirements
